Celebrating Renaissance Art



PAINTING CONTEST — HIGH SCHOOL

The **Arts Council of St. Charles County** and **Renaissance St. Louis** announce an art contest for high school students to celebrate the arts. The winners will be exhibited at the Renaissance Faire, May 16-June 7 at Wentzville's Rotary Park.

Preliminary judging will be by St. Charles County artists. The eight finalists' works will then be on display at the Renaissance Faire. Winners will be determined by the visitors to the Faire who will vote for their favorite paintings by donating to the **St. Charles County Arts Council's** Scholarship Fund. The eight finalists will receive passes to the Renaissance Faire, Renaissance Faire tee-shirts, and certificates. First place will be awarded \$100; second and third place winners will also receive monetary awards.

First round of judging will be completed by May 1. The eight finalists will have their works on display at the Faire from May 16 through June 7. After the Faire, artwork will be displayed at the Lillian Yahn Gallery of the **St. Charles County Arts Council**.

MURAL CONTEST — MIDDLE and HIGH SCHOOL

The **Arts Council of St. Charles County** and **Renaissance St. Louis, Inc.** are co-sponsoring the second annual mural contest for the Greater St. Louis Renaissance Faire. Last year's winner was Mrs. Kroeger's Art I Class of Barnwell Middle School, Francis Howell School District. This will be open to all St. Charles county middle and high school art clubs and classes – both public and private. The winning murals will be painted on canvas and then displayed at the faire. The goals of this event are to involve middle and high school students in an art activity that benefits the community and to instill an interest in art and history for students and faire-goers.

The **St. Charles Area Woodcarvers'** mission is to promote the appreciation and art of woodcarving and associated crafts such as wood burning and woodworking. The Club was originally formed as the Show Me Carving Club in 1985. In 1987, it merged with another club and became the St. Charles Area Woodcarvers Club (SCAWC). This diverse group of people has a wide variety of carving skills ranging from the novice to the professional. Meetings are held at 7:00 p.m. on the first and third Wednesday of each month. The meetings include a brief business meeting followed by a carving session. Other carving sessions include open carving with the Seasoned Eye Carvers on Monday and Wednesday mornings from 9 a.m. to noon. Check with club members for the location as it may vary. Visitors are always welcome for some camaraderie and wood carving!

Club dues are \$15.00 per year and include the website and electronic newsletter. Activities include instructional classes hosted by local and nationally known carvers, support of the arts through organizations such as the **Arts Council** (Arts Happening for Kids and the Pumpkin Happening at the Oktoberfest), and demonstrations at schools, fairs, and local events to promote the art of carving.

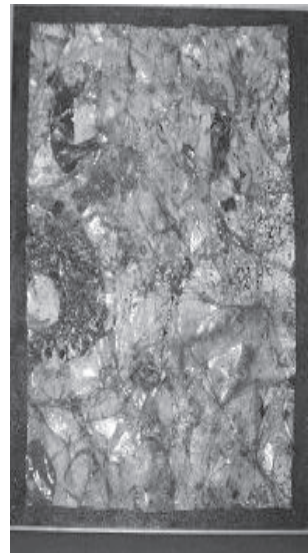
Spotlight on the Board: Patrick and Crystal

With the financial problems facing us all, the **Arts Council of St. Charles County** wishes to share with you the importance of supporting the arts. The **Arts Council's** mission is to enhance the quality of life of the County by providing a supportive climate for cultural organizations and activities. We offer help to new and established artists and host a variety of children's and adult's programs on site and in large venues. Now that we are in our new facility, we can offer art exhibits and displays for all ages and all ability levels.

We know that arts education encourages creativity and innovative thinking. Music, acting, and dance improve a wide range of life and academic skills. A report by the Arts Education Partnership refers to 62 separate studies pointing to "critical links" between the arts and proficiency in reading, writing, math, cognitive skills, motivation, and social behavior.
